
PASR Butler President's Message

GOOD COLA NEWS! HB 411 passed the PA House with a vote of 131-72. This step forward wouldn't have been possible without PASR members statewide whose outreach and dedication amplified the voices of over 60,000 retirees who have waited more than two decades for a Cost of Living Adjustment.

Now it is time to apply pressure on the Senate. Although you may write to whomever you like, understand that if you are not a constituent of that official, your voice may not be heard. It is said to be most effective to express opinions to your own elected officials.

The map shows that Butler County is divided among senators from 21, 40, 41 and 50, plus some of our members live over the line in neighboring counties.

To see how each Representative voted: House Roll Call Vote Summary #116 | 2025-2026 Regular Session - PA House of Representatives

The vote was April 9. It was referred on April 11 to the Senate Finance Committee. We CANNOT let it die there.

Make a plan. Try this: Make contacts weekly to your PA Senator, alternating email, US mail, and phone calls. Alternate local and Harrisburg contacts, but keep it up every week. This is a way that we grassroots folks can apply pressure.

So what is our message?

- 1. Ask that the COLA bill be considered.
- 2. Make it a priority. Some will say that everything is a priority but this IS a priority.
- 3. It needs to be at the budget table, not just in the Finance Committee. It needs to be part of the budget.
- 4. Convey a sense of urgency.
- 5. Add your personal story, if your wish.

Every voice matters. Together we can advocate for fairness and dignity for those who dedicated their careers to serving Pennsylvania.

Conversations and Decisions

At our 11:00 meeting on May 28, we need to talk a bit about finances. We have not had any fund-raising activities since covid. Because of previous success with our RECREO trips due to the late Margaret Hoffman, we have tightened the belt and are all right. The hall rental at Christ Community has increased. We need to think about finances moving forward.

- We did try a new RECREO trip but it didn't draw enough people to make it work.
- Some chapters have a dues increase. Many of our members are lifetime members so we have to think about how that would work for all.
- Some chapters offer a voluntary free donation along with the meal registration, a surcharge.
- We do have a 50-50 ticket sale at each meeting. Should we increase the price?
- What are your thoughts? It's time for some conversation about this.

Chapter Goals and Activities

PASR has established Chapter Goals and Activities. At our April Executive Committee meeting, we reflected on the first one and will look at each at the subsequent meetings. These Goals and Activities are a good tool for reflection of our effectiveness. Let's reflect on this together at the May 28 meeting which begins at 11:00 at the Masonic Shelter, Alameda Park.

GOAL 1: Expand/Improve Services to Others

Activity #1 - Develop/Participate In/Expand a Project or Activity Serving Youth The Community Service Committee is encouraging chapters to develop/participate in/expand a chapter activity which benefits youth of any age in their areas.

Activity #2 — *Increase Educational Support Grant(s)* The Educational Support Committee is encouraging chapters to award one or more Educational Support Grant(s) or to increase the amount of existing grants to active school personnel and/or support personnel in their areas.

Activity #3— Increase Social Services Memorial Honor Fund Services The Social Service Memorial Honor Fund Committee is encouraging chapters to increase services to temporarily "confined" (hospital, homebound, assisted living and nursing homes) members.

Activity #4— Initiate or Expand a Project or Activity Alleviating Hunger The Community Service Committee is encouraging chapters to either initiate or expand a special project or activity to alleviate hunger in their areas.

Activity #5— *Promote Individual Giving to Memorial Honor Fund* The Social Service Memorial Honor Fund Committee is encouraging the giving of individual and chapter donations to the Memorial Honor Fund that are given in honor or in memory of individuals.
