Community Service

The following PASR directive was sent to local chapter Community Service chair persons on January 10, 2020. "The PASR State Community Service Committee has decided to change the timeline for the submission of volunteer of the year awards. Previously, chapter chairs were expected to send Outstanding Volunteer completed nominations region chairs to by December 31. Region community service chairs then bundled and sent the Outstanding Volunteer nominations received from chapter chairs to HQ by January 15. HQ will now expect to receive the nominations from Region August 15, 2020. Chairs by Consequently, it is PASR's hope that all forms distributed having returned in the summer will simplify things for chapters in so far as all forms are distributed and returned around the same general time.

NEW TIMELINE

1. A reminder will be sent to all chapter Community Service Chairs in June/early July to collect data on the community service activities of their members.

- 2. Chapters will then send nomination forms and pin orders to Region Chairs by July 31st.
- 3. Region chairs will then send the forms to HQ by August 15th.
- 4. HQ will create the Awards and gather any pins that have been ordered and distribute them to Region Directors at the October Board of Directors meeting so that they may then distribute them to the appropriate chapters."

Therefore, the PASR 2019 Butler County Chapter Volunteer of the year award will be presented to one of our deserving members this fall. Continue to record your service and hours from **January 2019 to May 2020**.

The student items brought to the December 2019 luncheon were taken to the Center Ave. Community School by Ruth Scott. Walmart and Target \$10 gift cards are greatly appreciated, too. The Bingo prizes were delivered to Butler Life. Two large USPO boxes of manufacturers' coupons were sent to Navy commissaries in Guam Naples, Italy. I'm sure the families of these military men and women appreciated them.

Remember, collection items are needed all the time for those in need! These include: manufacturers' coupons, Box Tops for Education, pop can tabs, plastic bags for the "homeless mats", Pringle cans, clothing and school supplies, and Bingo prizes, gift cards, etc.

Region Director's Report

The PASR Board of Directors met on January 28 and 29. Judy Schaffer ran her first meeting as state president in an efficient manner. Most of Tuesday's

meeting involved reorganization for the 2020 calendar year.

Mark McKillop gave information on staff structure updates. All of the current employees are able to step in and assist any other employee. This helps things run smoothly because nothing is left undone because of a heavy workload for one particular person. He also informed us of a need to look at upgrading the computer system in the office. A motion was passed to transition to a cloud-based system.

Hamilton and Musser presented the auditor's report. We took in more money than went out during the past fiscal year. Even though we must continue to be frugal, we are improving financially.

On Wednesday Jeff Hunsicker, our lobbyist gave an update on the status of a COLA. During the past year we moved further along the path to passage than ever since the last COLA almost 20 years ago. With budget hearings starting in February, there will probably not be anything happening until spring, but there is still hope that there may be something for the Pre-Act 9 people.

The Member Benefits and Services Committee presented a recommendation that the BOD approve HeatUSA and TankFarm which could possibly save on propane and heating oil costs for our members. The Board of Directors passed both recommendations. PASR will receive nothing from these companies. All of the savings will be

given to the members who sign up. Check the state website under MB&S for additional information.

Because of the bylaws changes that were passed at the House of Delegates, the board passed updated policies for the L/PEC (Legislative) Committee and the Policy Committee. The Goals and Activities – 2020 were approved. Please check the state website for copies of these items.

There was a presentation by Diana Fessenmeyer about the **SSMHF** monies. The Social Memorial Fund has more money going out than coming in. There were many suggestions about how to improve this situation. At this point in time all chapters and members are being asked to make donations in honor or memory of members. Also, each chapter and region is being asked to take up a collection at their spring meetings to aid this fund.

Next Region 8 meeting is at Hoss's on March 19.

I never thought of Mrs. Cypher being a small person (I guess she would not have been to a third grader), but the last time I saw her she only came up to my shoulder, and I am 5'2"!


