Thank you so much for all of the volunteer service you do throughout the year!

After the May general membership meeting, we were able to supply Slippery Rock Elementary School with many summer activity items such as: jump ropes, coloring books and crayons, puzzles, playing cards, board games, juice drinks, and many more

creative things to keep the children busy throughout their summer recess and off the electronic devices!

We received a thank you for the military manufactures' coupons (see letter inside this newsletter) from the Navy Marine Corps in Rota, Spain and then we were able to send three large Post Office boxes to the Air Force commissaries in Okinawa, Japan, Yokota, Japan, and Lakenheath, United Kingdom. Postage expensive, but thanks to our 50/50 raffles, we are able to cover those costs without going into our general treasury.

In the May newsletter, we posted the Community Service Tally Sheet. I hope you kept that paper and are counting your hours from January 1 - December 31, 2016. We will be collecting them at the December general membership meeting. Even though the hours continue through the end of December, you can estimate your volunteer hours for the last few weeks of December.

As you enter the Christ Community United Methodist Church for our quarterly luncheons, please look at the carts loaded with your "gifts" to our neighbors and friends "far and wide". NEW PROJECT

Center Avenue Community School has been designated by the executive board as recipient of donations from our members for the 2016 – 2017 school year. Their population is both boys and girls ages 8 – 18, with most of them students in 7th – 12th grades

who are dealing with behavioral and emotional issues. Many come to school without breakfast. Some have not had the opportunity to bath. Clothing and personal hygiene items would be given to the school nurse to distribute as she sees a need. The Tornado 200 is an incentive program where all students can earn good behavior points to cash in for rewards. Here are some suggested items:

- Shoes
- General clothing: shirts, pants, sweatshirts, etc.
- Underwear and socks mostly for male students: maybe kids size 6-adult XL
- Deodorant
- Hair combs/brushes
- Toothpaste, toothbrushes, dental floss, mouthwash
- Snacks for Tornado 200 (i.e. individual bags of chips, cans of pop/juice boxes, etc.)
- \$5-\$10 gift cards for Tornado 200 incentives (Dunkin Donuts, Walmart, iTunes, McDonald's, Burger King)
- Grand Prizes for Tornado 200 (midyear and end of year for Alt. Ed. and ES)-last year the school gave away an iPad and Xbox
- Classroom incentives (candy, gum, mints, snacks)
- Age and content appropriate DVDs for in-classroom use
- Gift cards to local retailers to purchase shoes/clothes/etc. for students

(No matter how long you have been a local member, if you have never been a state member, you may also take advantage of this option.)

PISI provides our members the opportunity to purchase insurance in many areas at very reasonable rates. They have health, eye, dental, and even pet insurance. You must be a state member to take advantage of these member benefits. Please check the state web page to see what other member benefits are available to state members. Many of these benefits offset the \$60 cost of your state dues.

Another savings for state membership is the opportunity to pay for three years of membership all at once. If you choose this option, it will cost you \$150. That will save you \$30 for the three years.

November 30-December 3, 2016

Trip includes: the towns of Lititz and Ephrata in Lancaster County and "Winter Wonderland" at the American Music Theatre

Over the past two decades, **Christkindlmarkt Bethlehem** has delighted millions of guests from near and far with its mix of unique gift ideas, old-world charm and holiday cheer. The dynamic festival celebrates the magic of the holidays with a five-week run that features more than 125 vendors each week. Many of the vendors come from Europe where the Christkindlmarkt originated. In addition to visiting the markets there will be a "Bethlehem by Night Bus Tour" and other opportunities to become familiar with Moravian traditions and hopefully including special Moravian Music at the Central Moravian Church. There will be an opportunity to enjoy foods at the numerous vendors in the market.

Before arriving in Bethlehem, we will visit historic **Lititz**, "America's Coolest Small Town" with stops at **Sturgis's Pretzel Bakery** and **Wilbur Chocolate Company and the Candy Americana Museum.** The next stop will be **Ephrata** where you will have a walking tour of the **Ephrata Cloister**. This is one of the earliest religious communities that was founded in 1732 by German settlers seeking spiritual goals rather than earthly rewards. Gathered in unique European style buildings, the community consisted of celibate Brothers and Sisters, and a married congregation of families.

On the way home, we will stop in Lancaster for the 10:30 AM musical "Winter Wonderland" at the beautiful American Music Theatre. One of the eight meals included will be a lunch at the **Shady Maple Smorgasbord.** Lodging will be at Comfort Inn Lancaster North, Denver, and Comfort Inn Suites, Allentown.

This promises to be a trip full of Eastern Pennsylvania history about the Moravians when they came to Penna. This trip is sponsored by the Butler County School Retirees, Peg Harding, President, Jim Huemme, Treasurer.
