The PASR Mission Statement, above, sums it up. Butler Chapter is here to serve and help.

"Our chapter is currently on hold."

"We have had no newsletters or meetings this year."

The <u>majority of responders</u> are using newsletters, snail mail, phone calls, conference calls, and emails for those for whom they have email addresses.

So far Butler Chapter has had 3 exec board meetings and 2 general membership meetings via Zoom. A few chapters reported having a board meeting via Zoom, but I haven't found another that held a full Zoom chapter meeting. Butler Chapter will continue with online meetings. **NOTE:** Our next General Membership meeting is **March 24.** Also: May 26, Sept. 22, and Dec. 8. Plan to attend!

That's why I was asked to serve on this small committee that will conduct Zoom training. Butler Chapter has learned from experience, which has produced tips to share with other chapters who are ready to step up and move forward. We can serve others in need.

In 2020 PASR recommended *no* faceto-face meetings. That continues in 2021 for the spring but understand that it possibly could continue all 2021. There are those across the state who don't want to try Zoom or anything new, and are resigned to wait for face-to-face again. But wait two years???? I felt bad waiting six months to restart our Butler meetings. I thought I was derelict.

Let's look at it another way. When I graduated in 1973, I thought that I was ready to teach. I had my first job and was ready to go but slowly my district began to make changes based on new best practices. Endless inservice training caused us to stretch. I was involved with that as both a participant and a trainer. My last ten years of teaching had a very different look than my first ten years.

And then in 2011, I retired, joined PASR Butler (Thanks, Fergie!!) and started as newsletter editor in 2013. Butler Chapter had started in 1964 so was long established; members were comfortable that PASR would continue in the same way. I thought so, too.

Covid-19 has changed that. It just won't work to do nothing for two years. We have the technology to help ourselves and that's what we are doing! We have something of value here that we need to preserve for our own benefit as well as the advantage to our community.

Yes, I think it is fair to say that there was some ostrich behavior when we first tried a Zoom meeting. It is said that Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II sometimes has the same reaction when her family members have some outlandish media problems, but eventually, the point does come where even she must move forward. We need to get our heads out of the sand and face the need to meet via Zoom.

- Go out of your way to contact another member just to check in, to say hello, to support from a distance. Every one of us is experiencing change and perhaps, loss due to covid-19. Loss is hard. Feeling isolated is hard.
- Think about how you can get online. Talk to your young relatives/friends about this. It does not have to be a laptop. It is easiest, but you can also Zoom online via smart phone, tablet, iPad, and even just audio on your old cell or house phone with a landline if it has buttons. I've tested them all, just to be sure!
- 3. For video use, best to first download the Zoom app. Ask friends/relatives to set up a Zoom call so you can practice. No camera? If you have a USB outlet, you can get an external camera for less than \$20 on Amazon. Besides, think of the new family opportunities! It's fun!!!
- 4. Share with me how you are staying positive! We are pulling together!
