### President's Message

The following information was taken from the newest PASR Times *Newsletter*. "Once a year, PASR asks each chapter to honor one of our state members with the John Dillon Award. The John Dillon Service Award provides the opportunity for chapters to recognize individuals that have given service to the Association. Dr. John Dillon was a past president of the Association who was a consummate PASR volunteer. He held a record 38 positions in PASR, ranging from the local to the state level.

PASR wanted to develop a way to recognize the outstanding service provided to the association by individual volunteers at the local, region, and/or state level. Since Dr. Dillon was an ideal member, the PASR Board of Directors decided to name this recognition award in his honor."

At our March 28th luncheon, we were able to honor our Region VIII Director and past president of our Butler Chapter, **Mary K Davis**. Mary K retired from the Butler Area School District in 2005 and became a state lifetime PASR member that same year.

She volunteered her services as the Butler Chapter membership chairperson and has continued in that position for ten years. Additionally, she became the Region VIII while Membership chairperson continuing as the local chapter's membership chairperson. As Region VIII and Butler County Membership Chairperson, Mary K has served as a Membership Seminar speaker for various PASR State Conventions and leadership conferences.

Mary K was Butler Chapter President-Elect in 2011- 2012 and then became the Butler Chapter President while continuing as Region VIII and Butler County Membership Chair. Near the end of August each year, she contacted new retirees and other former retirees and invited them to our

Our Butler Chapter sends out 4 newsletters a year and Mary K made sure we had the mailing labels ready for those times as well as keeping the state headquarters "up to date" on death notices and expired local and state dues for our members.

Presently, Mary K is the Region VIII Director for Butler, Beaver, Mercer, and Clarion counties. Region VIII meetings are held twice a year in Grove City and it's the director's responsibly to inform the chapter presidents and region chairs of state happenings. She attends PASR Presidents Spring 2018 meetings in Mechanicsburg, PA as our leader, but also attends other state meetings when region chairs can't attend or when there is no chairperson for specific committees.

## PA's Beautiful State Capitol Building National Civil War Museum Butterfly Atrium "SISTER ACT"

#### Thursday-Friday October 4-5, 2018

Trip sponsored by Butler County School Retirees PASR

This will be an opportunity to have a guided tour through Pennsylvania's beautiful and highly acclaimed architectural and artistic **STATE CAPITOL**. It is a majestic symbol of history and power and an icon of democracy and freedom. You will be there exactly 111 years after the time that President Theodore Roosevelt attended the dedication of the building on October 4, 1906. He is quoted as saying "This is the handsomest building I ever saw." There should be some free time for you take a closer look at some areas and to visit the book store to get literature about the building and the functions of our government before leaving for your hotel at Elizabethtown.

After checking in at the **SureStay Plus by Best Western**, formally a Holiday Inn Express, you will go to the Dutch Apple Dinner Theatre for dinner and show. Dinner will be served with a choice of entrée offerings. The show is "*SISTER ACT*", the feel-good musical comedy smash based on the hit 1992 film. When disco diva, Delores, witnesses a murder, she is put in protective custody in the one place the cops are sure she won't be found: a convent! Disguised as a nun, she finds herself at odds with the uptight Mother Superior. Using her unique disco moves and singing talent to inspire the choir, Delores breathes new life into the church and community but blows her cover. Soon, the gang is after her, but find themselves up against her new found sisterhood. Filled with powerful gospel music, outrages dancing and a truly moving story, *Sister Act* will leave any audience rejoicing.

Friday morning begins with a hot breakfast at the hotel before departing for the Hershey Gardens in Hershey. Hershey Gardens opened in 1937 with Milton Hershey's request to "create a nice garden of roses" More than 75 years later, the small rose garden has blossomed into 23 acres of botanical beauty providing visitors with unique experiences and enriching opportunities. Overlooking the town of Hershey, the gardens feature a breathtaking assortment of flowers and shrubs and a collections of rare trees. There should be an abundance of fall flowers. **The year 'round Butterfly Atrium offers a truly spectacular experience.** Walk among 500-600 butterflies from around the world in a tropical setting that features colorful plants and a soothing water feature. Only one of 25 indoor, tropical butterfly atriums in the country, Hershey Gardens' Butterfly Atrium is home to dozens of rare butterflies from South and Central America, Africa and Asia.

The last stop before starting toward will be at **The National Civil War Museum** in Harrisburg. It will be a selfguided tour beginning on the second floor. There is an elevator. This is the only museum in the United States that portrays the entire story of the American Civil War. History is preserved in equally balanced presentations that are humanistic in nature without bias to Union or Confederate causes.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORT**

At our March luncheon, the community service "Volunteer of the Year for 2017" was awarded to Joanne Wilhelm.



Joanne Wilhelm, a former 7th grade Ancient Civilizations Social Studies teacher from the Slippery Rock Area School District,

retired in 1995. She has used her "free time" by volunteering throughout her community doing various social and religious services for young and old.

For the past 20 years, Joanne has volunteered at the local Food Cupboard and just recently retired to pursue other interests. Along with her husband and she volunteers with the others, Bartramian Audubon Society (In 1982, three Slippery Rock University students founded the Bartramian Audubon Society (BAS). Today, this local chapter serves all of Lawrence and Mercer Counties in addition to most of Butler and Venango Counties. BAS executes a number of programs that focus on rescuing, recovering, and rehealing the Earth's integrity to secure the future of all life and to teach ourselves, our children, and the public that whatever humans do to the web of life, we do to ourselves.") Recently, the group identified 69 species of birds in Butler County and 77 bird species in Mercer County. Every Sunday, Joanne teaches and adult Bible Study class at her church for 1 1/2 hours. This past year, she and the group traveled to Israel and saw first hand the sights Our Lord Jesus traveled and even swam in the Dead Sea.



Joanne has shown how a PASR retiree uses her time, talents, and skills to help others in her community and beyond. Congratulations, Joanne!

Three large boxes of manufacturers' **coupons** were sent to the Air Force commissaries in Guam and Kadena. Military families really appreciate these discount coupons and the Boxtops for Education.
