Hello,



COMMUNITY SERVICE

Because our state PASR convention wasn't held until after our last luncheon, the PASR Butler County Volunteer has been held over until our December luncheon. Please come to our luncheon meeting and congratulate our newest volunteer for 2013!

We are continuing to help our troops in as many ways as possible. Keep clipping those manufacture coupons and bring them to the December meeting. Remember, the expiration date requirement should not go back more than 2 months ago. Please make sure you separate the coupons into **FOOD** and **NON-FOOD** items and place them in separate baggies or envelopes.

There is a wonderful website for you to help our military and their families. Go to <u>soldiersangels.org</u> and find out what you, as an individual, can do to help support our troops here and abroad.

The grant for "worry dolls" for the children of the men and women deployed overseas has been eliminated, but our county will be giving the dolls out to the local boys and girls, instead. Our chapter is still making helmet hats for the military, and collecting pop can tabs, used ink cartridges, tote bags for Guatemala,

plastic bottle caps, Pringle cans, and Bingo prizes. All these items can be returned at the luncheon and new materials, clothes pins, embroidery thread, and flannel can be picked up at the meeting, too.

The state PASR wants all chapters to continue working with our K-12 youth. So when you are shopping for Christmas presents in the next few weeks, buy an extra pair of socks, gloves, mittens, ear muffs, pencils, paper, etc., and we will give them to our needy children in Butler County. **Bring them to the luncheon**, and we'll distribute them. The state PASR also wants to help the hungry in our communities, so nonperishable food items and paper products will be greatly appreciated, too.

If you can think of other ways we can help our youth throughout the year, please let me know. This will be an ongoing project, so let's come up with some unique ideas.

Also, please let me know if you and some other PASR volunteers are working on special projects for our youth and/or community members. If you need other PASR volunteers, I'm sure we can find them for you!

Wisconsin Dells & House on the Rock

June 16 - 20, 2014

Tour sponsored by Butler County School Retirees (PASR)

Day 1 - MONDAY, June 16, Hoffman Estates, IL: Enjoy a leisurely travel day to the Comfort Inn, Hoffman Estates, IL. There will be rest stops and lunch before having dinner at Hoffman Estates. (L, D)

Day 2 - TUESDAY, June 17, Wisconsin Dells: This morning we stop at The Angel Museum in Beloit, WI, that features more than 12,000 angels including the Berg Angel Collection as well as nearly 500 black angels donated by Oprah Winfrey. We then travel to Wisconsin Dells for lunch at Paul Bunyan's 'Northwoods Cook Shanty'. Don't be too concerned about the title, so named because the main dining room looks like a frontier log cabin with wood beams across the ceiling. The food is plentiful and delicious. Following lunch we will take the 2 Hour Boat Tour of the Upper Dells. This includes sights of sandstone cliffs, rock formations and stops at Witches Gulch and Stand Rock. After the boat ride, we will travel a short distance to Baraboo to check in at the Clarion Inn & Convention Center for a two-night stay. Dinner tonight will be at the Wisconsin Opry followed by lots fun and country music by local and national performers. (B, L, D)

Day 3 - WEDNESDAY, June 18, House on the Rock, Spring Green, WI: This unusual house built by Alex Jordon is perched atop a rock pinnacle. The original 14room Main House incorporates natural stone walls and a waterfalls. A highlight is the cantilevered Infinity Room which extends 218 feet out over the valley and 156 feet above the forest floor, offering scenic views through floor to ceiling windows. In addition to the Main House, there are many themed rooms filled with eclectic collections, such as the world's largest carousel, doll houses, circuses, Street of YesterYears, and the blue music rooms, just to mention a few. There are several food stands throughout the house for easy lunch-rest stops. After spending several hours at the house, we return to Wisconsin Dells for a 1-hour ride on the Ducks, the open-air amphibious vehicles built during World War II. You will have some free-time to walk around town before we go for dinner at Perkins Restaurant and then attend the 8:30 PM Tommy Bartlett Spectacular Water Show. This will be a 90-minute performance on water, stage and high in the sky. There will likely be some daredevil entertainers, with comedy and stage acts. Closing with the Entrancing

Water Finale, a spectacular mix of color and patriotic music. Return to Clarion Inn at Baraboo, WI. (B, D)

Day 4 - THURSDAY, June 19, "Driving Miss Daisy": Matinee dinner show at Fireside Dinner Theatre, Ft. Atkinson, WI. After a leisurely breakfast at the hotel we begin the journey home, stopping for the 11:30 AM lunch and the much loved show. We return to the Comfort Inn, Hoffman Estates tonight. Dinner at a local restaurant. (B, L, D)

Day 5 - FRIDAY, June 20, Shipshewanna, IN: Lunch at the Blue Gate Amish Restaurant and have time to walk along the streets and shop in this MennoniteAmish village.
