REPORT FROM REGION 8 DIRECTOR, POLLY SHAW

With the election of Mary K Davis to PASR Vice-President, Region 8 was left without a vote on the PASR state Board of Directors, since no one may serve as both a Region Director and as a state officer. I was appointed as a substitute to attend the Feb. 2 meeting. At the May 24 Region 8 Zoom meeting, I was elected Region 8 Director to fill out Mary K's term, which expires December 31, 2022. I serve on the Leadership now Development, Chapter Support, and Committees. **By-Laws** At the November 2 region meeting, there will be an election for the term Jan. 1, 2023-Dec. 31, 2024. The Strategic Planning Committee is addressing ongoing and growing issues concerning lack of leadership at chapter levels, leading some to dissolve and/or fold. The Armstrong and Indiana Chapters may merge.

COLA has not advanced. It was crowded out by a plethora of big items on the table. There is a PASR focus on making legislators see it as affordable and to communicate with gubernatorial candidates to lay foundation with each of them. The Chapter Support Committee (to be renamed Chapter Outreach) is sending out a statewide Survey Monkey on August 31 to assess chapter needs. Each chapter is to complete one survey. Four \$25 gift cards will be awarded by random drawing to chapters that compete the survey.

PASR asks each chapter to offer the opportunity to members to sign a petition to have Russell Diesinger placed on the PSERS Board of Trustees. Each person signing must be part of PSERS (our retirement) and must list the last 4 digits of the SS code. This is required because PSERS will check the numbers and names against the list of PSERS members to verify each petition. state Russell Diesinger is our President-elect and will serve with our interests in mind. The petition was circulated at our Butler Exec meeting, Board SO we have participated. (The deadline is before our Sept 28 meeting.)

A financial incentive award may be won for chapters that increase duel membership to both state and local. The three awards possible are \$750, \$500, and \$250. If you are currently a local but not a state member, please consider joining at the state level. Talk to a chapter officer about joining at the state level.
